

2011 STARTALK Chinese Language Camp Check List – Non-Hawaii Students

(Please submit after your official acceptance to the camp)

Upon notification of acceptance to the camp, each student must send the following materials to officially confirm his/her participation in our STARTALK program. Failure to do so may result in cancellation of the original acceptance.

Submit via **E-MAIL** to dtschudi@hawaii.edu by **May 15, 2011**:

- ___ 1. A digital **high resolution head-shot** in jpg format (most recent preferred).
- ___ 2. A brief paragraph introducing yourself to other camp participants.

Submit via **MAIL** by **May 20, 2011**:

___ 1. Your round-trip travel itinerary, if available. Please arrive on Monday, July 4, 2011 and depart on Saturday, July 23, 2011. Please also note that the UH on-campus housing check-in begins at 2 pm and check-out is by 12 pm. We recommend that you find flights to fit these parameters. Airport pick-up and drop-off will be arranged upon your request. If you have a special request for pick-up and drop-off of your child(ren) (meeting at the arrival gate, etc.), please notify us in writing in advance.

___ 2. A check payable to **East Asian Outreach** in the amount of \$600.

(Note: if you need to cancel your participation due to an unexpected emergency, a written notification of Voluntary Withdrawal must be provided to the Camp Coordinator by **June 10, 2011** to receive a 50% refund; thereafter, there will be no refund.)

___ 3. A photocopy, front and back, of your current valid health insurance card. This will be used to obtain medical treatment for you, if required.

___ 4. A doctor's prescription for any medications that you are to take while at camp. (All medications must be properly labeled and in original containers. They will be inspected by the Camp Director/Dorm Counselors upon your arrival. You will be expected to self-medicate according to directions, and NOT share your medication with others.)

___ 5. Written instructions from your parent or guardian listing any over-the-counter medications you may NOT be given (aspirin, antihistamines, antiseptics, antibiotic ointments, etc.). Medications not on this list might be offered to you if deemed helpful by camp staffers.

___ 6. University of Hawaii WH-1 Statement of Citizenship and Federal Tax Status form. This is for university fiscal purposes only and you will not be taxed.

___ 7. Signed 2011 STARTALK Chinese Language Camp Rules and Dress Code.

___ 8. STARTALK Central Consent Form.

Please be reminded again that the selection to participate in our camp is not guaranteed until all requested materials are received, so please do not delay.

2011 STARTALK Chinese Language Camp Rules
(**Participants:** please read thoroughly and initial each item)

- _____ I will strive to meet the goals of the 2011 Chinese Language Camp by interacting in Chinese as much as possible, have FUN and learn as much as I can.
- _____ I understand that this camp is a residential program and requires full-time commitment from each participant during the course of the camp.
- _____ I will be present, prepared and on time for all classes and activities to which I have been assigned.
- _____ I will respect guests, visitors, fellow students, professors, instructors, counselors and all staff involved in this program.
- _____ I will dress modestly and appropriately for the duration of the camp (no T-shirts with obscene language, revealing clothing, etc.).
- _____ I will turn off cell phones and other electronic items during language and sports instruction as a courtesy to all.
- _____ I will not invite any visitor to camp without prior written permission from the camp director, the lead instructors or the coordinator.
- _____ I will fully comply with the camp curfew schedule during evening hours in the dorm.
- _____ I will not allow students of the opposite sex in my room at any time except during a group study session.
- _____ I will not use drugs (other than necessary personal medication as registered with the camp administration), drink alcoholic beverages or smoke cigarettes, nor will I buy or provide drugs, alcohol beverage and cigarettes to any other person at the camp.
- _____ In addition to these camp rules and the University of Hawaii campus regulations, I agree to conform to any safety or other rules specified during the course of the camp.
- _____ I understand that I will be responsible for any extra costs, which will NOT be covered by the camp, whenever they are incurred (through loss or for extra purchases).
- _____ I understand that I will be financially responsible for any damages I may cause at the camp, its facilities, or other related venues, as well as for any medical expenses that I may incur.
- _____ I understand that violation of posted rules may result in an immediate termination of my participation with the camp and I may be sent home at my own expense.

2011 STARTALK Chinese Language Camp Dress Code

- Dress in Hawaii is casual.
- No bare midriff tops, bathing suits, or other revealing clothing that might interfere with the educational process.
- Pants must fit at the waist and underwear must not show.
- No clothing or jewelry displaying graphics related to alcohol, sex, controlled substances or the promotion of gangs or violence.
- No chains or spiked apparel.
- Students must do laundry every week as a courtesy to all participants and camp staff. UH on-campus housing has laundry facilities with coin-operated washer/dryer.
- A camp T-shirt will be provided to all participants, and this T-shirt is required to be worn on all excursion activities off-campus.

For Martial Arts Classes:

- Sneakers/tennis shoes are mandatory. For safety reasons, no bare feet are not allowed.
- Comfortable outfits, such as workout shirts and shorts (of appropriate length), are recommended.
- No jeans in sports sessions.
- Chinese tradition is long pants, a loose shirt and Wushu shoes. Sneakers may be substituted. Loose T shirts may be worn.
